

OPTION LIST For students starting the IB Diploma programme in 2017 – updated 020517

Below you will see the option columns for the IB Diploma programme for students starting August 2017. The option columns are based on the scheduling of the classes.

Students chose their options by completing a google form online, the link will be sent to students when they are accepted to the programme.

Read carefully the following guidelines.

- You MUST chose ONLY one choice in each option column.
- You must have at least one Science subject (Chemistry/ Physics/ Biology/Sports, Exercise and Health Science (SEHS))
- You must have at least one Social science (Philosophy/Economics/History/Business and Management (Bus Man)/Global Politics)
- You must also have no more than three subjects at SL

For Swedish, English and Self taught Lit stands for the course “Literature” and L/L stands for the course “Literature and Language”.

*If you have another mother tongue (Language A) other than English or Swedish you can take this language as a “school supported self taught Language A Lit SL ” as long as it is offered by the IB. Please contact Kerry Browning to check. This would then count as your Option 1 or Option 2.

- Groups that are very small may not be started in which case the pupil might have to change their options.
- Some subject groups may be full on application
- Be aware that to be accepted onto many Swedish university courses, an applicant must have equivalent to Swedish A SL/HL. Swedish B SL/HL does not give a student the correct qualifications. If a student is taking Swedish B they must complement their language qualifications by taking a TISUS test, *Test in Swedish for university studies*. These tests are organized by Stockholm University and occur twice a year, November and May.
